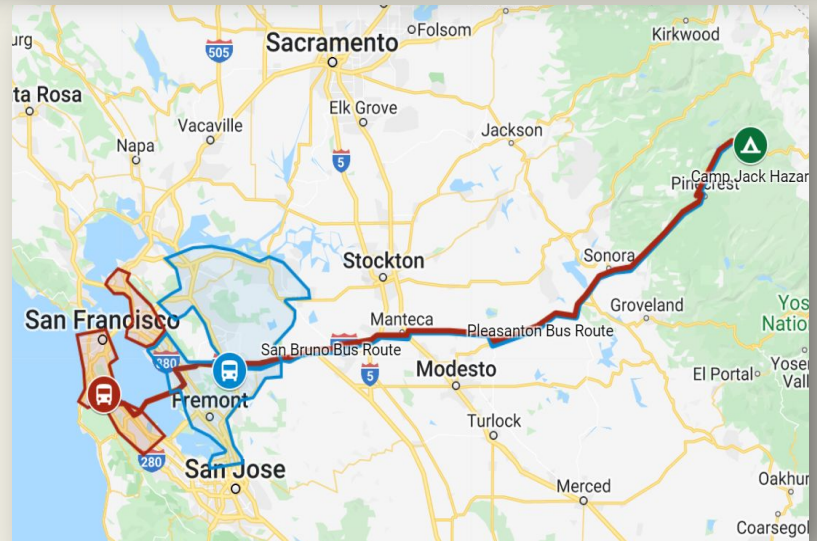
Nestled in the heart of the Sierra-Nevada

- Did you label your luggage and your backpack for Arrival Day?
- Did you review the list of forbidden items/cell phone rules from the CAMPER CONDUCT WAIVER?

- Filled reusable water bottle
- Labeled disposable camera
- Returning campers: Are you wearing your scarf?
- Eat a good breakfast and put on some sunscreen!

CAMP ARRIVAL DAY- Check in and loading

Arrival

You may leave the luggage in the car or set it aside until you receive your luggage tags. Please note that sometimes the below steps may change in order or detail depending on logistics.

STATION/Step One is the lice check.

CSA site volunteer does a quick check for lice

CSA site volunteer gives the camper their name tag, has the child move on to Station/Step Two

STATION/Step Two is actual check-in.

Parent/Guardian fills camper's full name and puts name tag on outermost clothing of camper

Parent/Guardian submits the labeled Medical Update Form and meds, if any.

CSA site volunteer ensures each child has a bagged lunch and reusable water bottle, and provides luggage tags.

Note: lunches stay in their own backpacks this year. They eat on the bus!

Parent/Guardian affixes the luggage tags on everything including backpack

Parent/Guardian helps get luggage to Station Three, the bus loading area

STATION/Step Three is luggage. (ZERO food allowed in luggage! Only the backpack!)

Parent/Guardian helps load bottom of bus (if driver allows)

CAMP ARRIVAL DAY- Have fun!

Goodbye, lets go to Camp!

- Do the children have their backpacks?
- Have they used the restroom?
- Have they handed their phones and devices back to their parents/guardians? (Optional)

Chaperone uses the bus roster to board children, one by one by name **masks optional**
Once all are boarded, chaperone or volunteer say a prayer with the kids for the journey.

Chaperone **with help from volunteers** rallies the campers to scream and be ready for camp and to wave goodbye to parents.

Chaperone instructs bus driver to close doors and head out

- Remaining staff will answer any questions from the parents/guardians
- Remaining staff will have extra Who When Where documents for pick up times!
- We encourage you to check Facebook for pictures during the week and for updates!

What to wear and bring



We recommend hiking boots. Athletic shoes can be worn instead

Shoes must:

- Be closed toed (no flip flops or slides outside of pool house)
- Have laces (no Tom's, UGG's or Crocs)
- Be worn with **visible socks** at all times.



What to wear and bring



It can get hot during the day

It can get pretty cold at night – layers are best!

All tops (shirts, tanks tops, hoodies, etc) should be free from any alcohol, cigarette, sex, violence, drug references, as well as free from violent imagery or foul language.

No belly tops or sagging jeans.



What to wear and bring



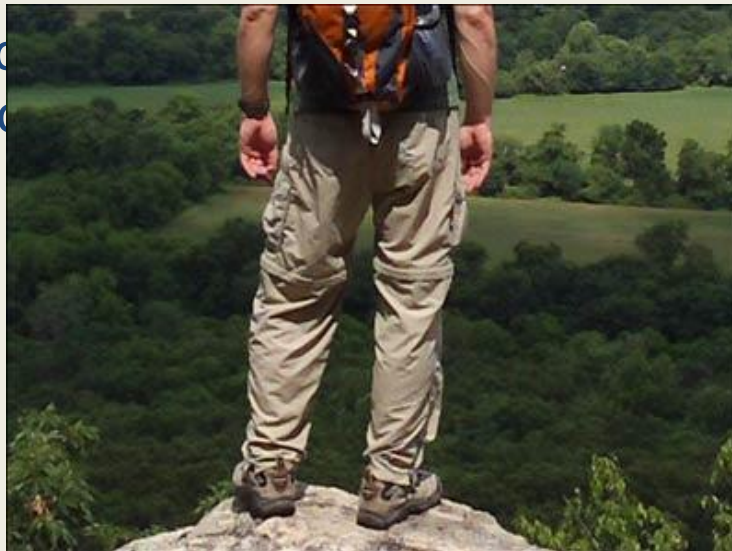
It is good to stay hydrated, protected from the sun during the day, and warm enough at night.



What to wear and bring

Pants and Shorts must:

- fit well
- Shorts for hot weather
- Pants for cool evenings and certain activities
- nothing offensive
- avoid wording on bottoms





What to wear and bring

- Should be Sturdy and Reusable
- Must be labeled (Masking Tape with Sharpie works)
- Should seal completely
- Camelbak's are accepted

Cell Phones

There is no cell service or outlets at the camp facility. As noted in the CAMPER CODE OF CONDUCT form (attached below), cell phones cannot be used in any capacity (not for pictures, not for reading, not for games) by campers or LTs once on facility grounds. Though we do allow digital cameras, we highly recommend you use or pack disposable cameras instead. Camp St. Andrews is not responsible for any theft or damage to

campers will attend a daily, non-denominational service in the outdoor chapel. The Friday chapel may also include Eucharist service. Please discuss with your camper if you want them to participate in this portion of service.

Visitors

There is only seven days, there is no "Visitor's Day" and no unscheduled visitors are allowed on the camp. Visitors are considered for access to the premises, prior approval must be obtained from the Camp Director, but is not limited to the completion of additional forms and a background check.

"I'll come get you"

The American Camp Association: "The most common mistake parents make is the Pick-up Deal. It's an unspoken rule to ask, "What if I feel homesick?" Tell your child that some feelings of homesickness are normal and practice coping before camp starts. But never ever say, "If you feel homesick, I'll come get you." This conveys a message of doubt and pity that undermines children's confidence and self-reliance. Deal with homesickness by becoming a mental crutch and self-fulfilling prophecy for children as soon as they arrive. Spending practice time away from home, a child is still very anxious about overnight camp until next summer." <https://www.aca.org/topics/parenting/camp-women>

Cancellation

If you cannot go to camp due to illness, please let the registrar know as soon as possible, as we normally have other campers on our waiting list. REFUNDABLE CAMPER FEES are refunded as outlined in the refund policy on the Terms & Conditions page at campstandrews.org

Spending Money/Cash

CAMPER FEES cover all meals, snacks, activities, transportation, camp photo, and camp t-shirt. No money should be brought to camp.

Bunkmates

Cabin assignments will be based on gender, age, and maturity level. Within these parameters, we try to accommodate (but cannot guarantee) requests for friends and/or family to be assigned within the same cabin/group.

Transportation

The CAMPER FEE includes transportation by bus to and from camp. We offer pick-up and drop-off service from either San Bruno or Pleasanton. Departure day call times, items to bring, location, Return Day estimations and overall logistics can be found on the WHO, WHERE, WHEN, WHAT page. Please note, we conduct a health check before final boarding - details below in HEALTH SCREENING section. As outlined in the CAMPER CODE OF CONDUCT, a serious violation could be grounds for dismissal. In the rare case of a camper being sent home, it's the parent/guardian's responsibility to retrieve their camper in a timely manner, at their own expense.

Health Screening

On departure day, CSA volunteers must conduct a health check on campers and staff that will include a head lice check, MEDICAL UPDATE FORM review, medication regimens/cataloging, and a general health assessment. Any camper or staff member who poses a potential health risk to the camp community may be denied boarding the bus to camp, or may be subject to quarantine if the illness is discovered upon arrival at camp, and then sent home. CAMPER FEES will not be refunded in these cases. For 2023 CSA is not requiring Covid-19 vaccinations, but self-tests on Arrival Day, and masking is completely optional. CSA may be required to follow any state or federal government guidelines.

Head Lice Policy

A camper with any nits or lice will not be allowed to board the bus. The bus chaperone/location coordinator will connect you to discuss next steps. In some cases, you may be allowed to take your camper home, treat them, wash laundry, and bring them back to camp within 24 hours. In such a case, they will be rechecked upon arrival at camp to confirm the absence of lice/nits prior to participation in the camp week.

Medication

The CAMPER REGISTRATION INFORMATION provided Camp St. Andrews with the camper's medical history, immunization record, medication needs, your over-the-counter medicines authorization, and medical insurance information/directives. If your camper takes any prescribed medication, over-the-counter medication, or vitamins, you will be required to complete and hand in the MEDICAL UPDATE FORM on the day of departure (available online via download on our website under FORMS). The signed form and medication must be given to the bus chaperone/location coordinator at check-in, and not kept with the camper. If you have any questions or concerns, you may speak with the Medical Director prior to camp. Please do not use camp as a "vacation" from prescribed medication!

Q & A ?

How can we see pictures of our kids?

Answer: We have access to an internet connection for daily uploads of pictures and updates of our session during the week of camp. We will post these at <http://facebook.com/csasanbruno>

What is the shower situation?

Answer: The shower house is located within close walking distance of the cabins. It has one section for males and one section for females. Hot water, power, sinks, showers and toilets. It is a bit rustic as you would find in a typical campground location: Individual Shower stalls for privacy with a bench and changing area separate from the other areas of the shower house. We do have flip flops, slides on the packing list as optional for shower purposes.

What is the weather like?

Answer: 2024 week of camp is predicted to have highs in the mid 80's and lows in the 50's. It is usually clear though some years we have indeed had a few showers or sprinkles. The packing list encourages a selection of clothing that can be layered to accommodate the different temperatures of the week.

What about the air quality, local fires? In relation to those with asthma?

Answer: We by policy monitor the air quality and any fire situation along with the administrators of the Camp Jack Hazard facility. If air quality became a concern, we may opt to limit activity or change the schedule. If used, do pack an inhaler and indicate on the Medical Update Form

Are you enforcing Vaccinations? For 2024 CSA is not requiring Covid-19 vaccinations, nor self-tests on Arrival Day, and masking is completely optional. CSA may be required to follow any state or federal government guidelines.

Is the bus drop off in the same location? Around what time are the campers expected back?

Answer: Yes, the campers will be dropped off at their pickup location. We give a range of "3:30 to 4:30" arrival due to the fluid nature of traffic and buses. By checking the @csasanbruno Facebook page, you'll be able to know when the buses have left the facility and a newly update eta time.

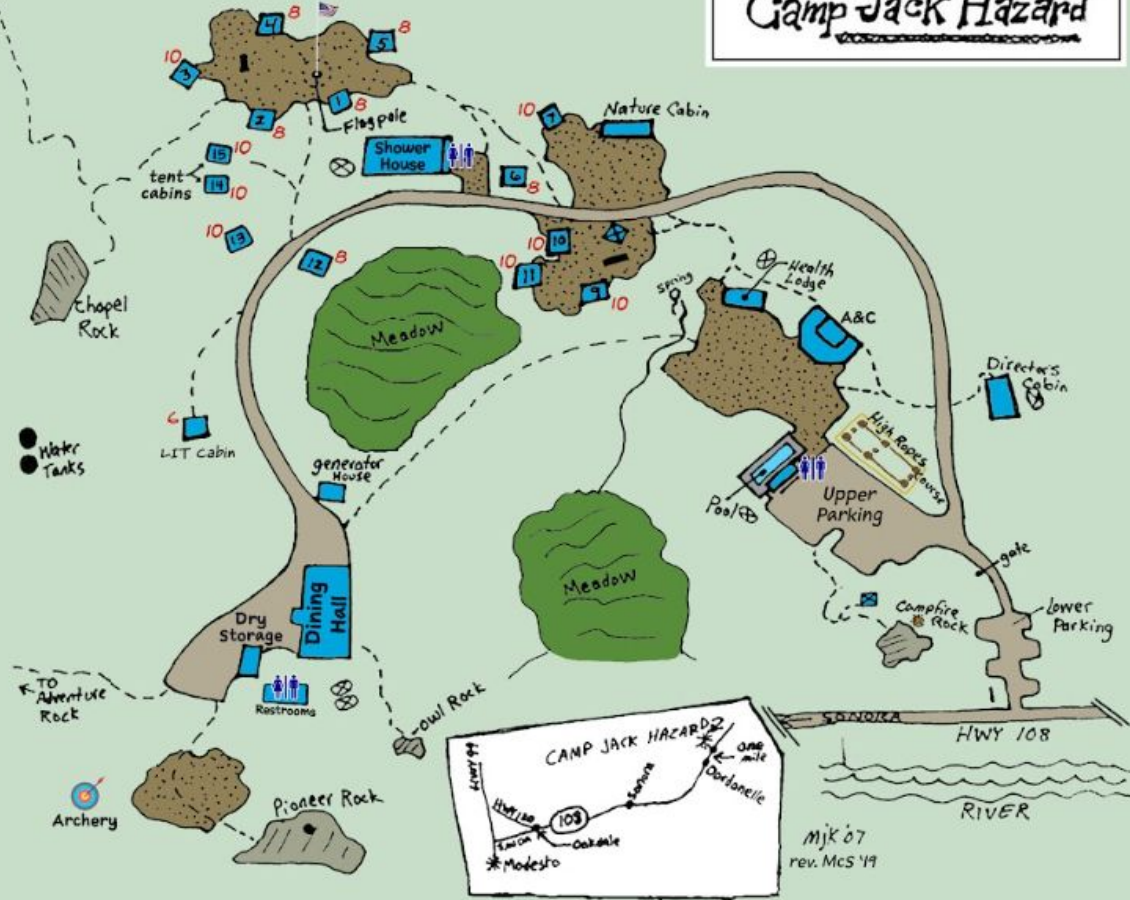

Camp Jack Hazard



Parents: Please read this document with your camper(s) and ensure they fully understand the outlined rules and expectations. This was a waiver already signed / checked upon completed registration online. Thank you!

The staff of Camp St. Andrews is committed to providing a safe and enjoyable experience for every camper; however, campers are also responsible to assist in these efforts. Parents are responsible for ensuring their camper understands the guidelines below. Each camper must read and sign the Camper Code of Conduct Contract before coming to camp so they know what is expected of them.

Campers must inform staff if they are experiencing a problem with another camper or other issues. If we are not informed about a problem, we cannot stop the problem or assist the camper.

You promise to follow these very important rules to make sure that every camper and staff member who attends this year gets to have as much FUN at camp as you will. Every single one of these rules has been established to ensure YOUR safety and enjoyment, as well as ALL the other campers and staff members at Camp St. Andrews.

- Campers are responsible for ALL of their belongings at ALL times. Staff are not responsible for lost or stolen items. It is at the risk of the camper when bringing items to camp.
 - Campers will not bring electronic equipment including but not limited to: Music players/iPods, video games, laptops, tablets, Kindles/e-Readers. Mobile phones may be brought, but must stay packed away until departure home.
 - Campers will participate fully in the program, and follow the daily camp schedule, including wake-up and curfew.
 - Campers will follow ALL camp policies and rules, as well as directions given by the counselors. Any inappropriate behavior will be handled at the discretion of the counselors and staff, based on severity and camp rules.
 - Campers will be responsible for their own behavior, they will be respectful to other campers and staff. Use of profanity, vulgar language, or obscene gestures are unacceptable.
 - Campers will not intimidate, harass, threaten, or bully others. Acts of violence will not be tolerated. Pushing, kicking, hitting or fighting are not acceptable behavior, will not be tolerated, and will be grounds for dismissal from the camp program.
 - Campers will respect the personal space and property of others. They will not go in any other cabins other than their own. They will not take things that do not belong to them.
 - Campers will dress appropriately for a co-ed outdoor recreation experience. Socks and closed toed shoes at all times except while showering / swimming. Wearing offensively worded or graphic clothing is not acceptable.
 - Campers will not leave their cabin group without your counselor knowing. Campers will not play with matches or fire.
 - Campers will not have or use drugs, alcohol, tobacco or fireworks while at camp. Campers will not have any firearm or weapons, including knives while at camp.
- Campers will not violate local, state or federal laws.
- Campers will not intentionally damage camp facilities including graffiti; you will be billed for damages.
 - CAMPERS WILL HAVE FUN!

Violation of the CODE OF CONDUCT can be grounds for dismissal; this may result in parents/guardians arranging transportation home, at their expense. I understand that refunds are not given when campers are dismissed from the program.
